AN INTRODUCTORY REMARK

ENG// MayinArt Gallery, a curated online platform for art which is based in Singapore, has set up its direct presence in Indonesia and pledged its increased commitment while bringing hope to Indonesian artists in these difficult times. Since the COVID-19 hit and rocked the international art market, many art galleries all over the world were forced to go out of business. However, MayinArt remains dedicated to regularly holding physical and online exhibitions to support their artists. Recently MayinArt has set up its office and a brand new gallery in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. The launch of the gallery will be held on October 31, 2021, at Perumahan Sonosewu Baru 446, Yogyakarta, Indonesia.

Having its head office in Singapore, MayinArt has had a strategic role in promoting artworks of Indonesian artists. Singapore is an important art hub in Asia and its geographical proximity to Indonesia makes it the main gateway for Indonesian artists to appear on the international art scene. Even though it is an online-based gallery, since 2018, MayinArt has consistently held physical exhibitions and participated in various art fairs in Singapore as well as other countries such as the Philippines, New York and others.

Baru-baru ini MayinArt telah mendirikan kantor dan galeri baru di Yogyakarta, Indonesia. Peluncuran galeri akan dilaksanakan pada 31 Oktober 2021, di Perumahan Sonosewu Baru 446, Yogyakarta, Indonesia.

Berkantor pusat di Singapura, MayinArt memiliki peran strategis dalam mempromosikan karya seni seniman Indonesia. Singapura adalah pusat seni penting di Asia dan kedekatan geografisnya dengan Indonesia menjadikannya pintu gerbang utama bagi seniman Indonesia untuk tampil di kancah seni internasional. Meskipun merupakan galeri berbasis online, sejak tahun 2018, MayinArt secara konsisten mengadakan pameran fisik dan mengikuti berbagai pameran seni di Singapura maupun negara lain seperti Filipina, New York dan lain lain.

Unique business model

MayinArt is not a just another art marketplace. It is a curated online platform for original art. Their primary goal of discovering undiscovered artists and their art, and empowering them with better possibilities is also complemented by our drive to bring original and high-quality art to collectors around the world at affordable prices. The curation process is not limited to choosing artists and artworks, but also includes capturing the artists' creative emotions and feelings while building the content for the artwork details that we present on our website. This paves way for deeper relationships with every artist on their platform and in other words, MayinArt curates not just the artworks but also the artist relationships.

MayinArt is a mature e-commerce platform. "We carefully select the artists and their works. Not all artists who submit their applications are accepted. Even with existing artists, we select the works we want to bring in and share our feedback from our collectors with the artists to enhance their skills. Our aim is to unearth genuine and unique talents who are struggling to find exposure for their quality works," said Krish Datta, founder of MayinArt Gallery. In the interest of finding quality artists and works, MayinArt has a local team of curators and art management facilities in their focused countries.

Model bisnis yang unik

MavinArt bukan sekadar marketplace, melainkan sebuah platform online vana dikurasi untuk karva seni oriainal. Tuiuan utama MavinArt adalah menemukan seniman dengan bakat seni mereka yang belum banyak diungkap, memberdayakan mereka dan kemudian membawa karya seni berkualitas tinggi mereka kepada kolektor di seluruh dunia dengan haraa terianakau. Proses kurasi tidak terbatas pada pemilihan seniman dan karya seni, tetapi juga menangkap emosi dan perasaan kreatif seniman sambil membangun konten untuk detail karya seni yang kami sajikan di situs web kami. Ini membuka jalan untuk hubungan yang lebih dalam dengan setiap seniman yang bergabung, atau dengan kata lain, MayinArt tidak hanya mengkurasi karya seni tetapi juga membangun hubungan dengan seniman. MayinArt adalah platform e-commerce yang berpengalaman. "Kami dengan hati-hati memilih seniman dan karya mereka. Tidak semua seniman yang mengirimkan lamarannya diterima. Bahkan dengan seniman yang sudah bergabung dengan kami, kami memilih karya yang ingin kami bawa dan memberikan feedback dari kolektor kami kepada seniman untuk mengembangkan bakat dan teknik mereka. Tujuan kami adalah untuk menggali bakat asli dan unik seniman yang kesulitan menemukan eksposur untuk karya-karya mereka," kata Krish Datta, pendiri MayinArt Gallery.

MayinArt makes the entire process from creation to curation and consumption, transparent, efficient and fair. "The online world has provided opportunities for democratizing art and extending equal opportunities for artists all over the world. MayinArt also strives to curate artists from various backgrounds and experiences. we don't just focus on a few well-known artists. We equally push young and lesser-known artists through our various channels for overseas promotion," said Krish Datta.

MayinArt's Story

The Mavinart story started several years ago when Krish Datta was the Managing Director of SAP Since 1995 while working there, he Indonesia. remained deeply involved with Indonesia. Having received art training himself, Krish got attracted to the diversity and the creative talent of Indonesia. "The desire to work on a platform to help artists and bring Indonesian art to the global stage has been brimming inside me since my early days in allowed me to Indonesia Circumstances eventually put my dreams into action only much later and I started meeting the artists community and making connections around 2014" shared Krish

The need to ao online was clear because the intent was to reach a global market, create interest in Indonesian artworks and most importantly to accomplish these goals with transparency. lower cost and efficiency. After a significant number of artists and artworks were curated. MavinArt first went online in 2018 and since then have been focusing on renewed targets to widen the choice and buyer base, hence creating more opportunities for Indonesian artists. Mavinart, today has a strong collector base, a growing online presence, a tech and a marketing team, dedicated curators and other support teams across 3 countries. MayinArt will soon be a significant player in the emerging art market in South Asia

The exhibition titled "If Walls Could Speak #2 – Jogja Series" is part of the MayinArt gallery launch in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. Mayinart, saat ini memiliki basis kolektor yang kuat, kehadiran online yang berkembang, tim teknologi dan pemasaran, kurator khusus, dan tim pendukung lainnya di 3 negara. MayinArt akan segera menjadi pemain penting di pasar seni yang sedang berkembang di Asia Selatan.






"Art gives form and value to my creativity"


AT Sitompul is an Indonesian Abstract artist popular for creating geometric abstractions. Greek philosopher Plato believed that geometry was the highest form of beauty. Geometric abstract artworks are non-objective and aims to convey a sense of simplicity and purity.

Sitompul's imagery swells and vibrates to create an optical illusion. He creates a 'matrix effect' with a combination of language elements like cuneiform and braille, stark parallel lines, repetitive geometric patterns and open color fields. He adeptly creates dynamic visuals interspersed with static abstraction. It is sheer visual harmony to see the patterns of lines, strokes and language elements all come together to form a beautiful piece of art. The intricate mysteries of his works can draw in the viewer and provide a start to a great narrative.


Budi Ubrux



Budi Ubrux is an award winning Indonesian Master Artist. Ubrux's paintings are alarming and haunting, yet aesthetic and alluring. His works are characterized by faceless mummified figures covered in newsprint, illustrating powerful satirical observations on topical social and political degeneration.

He vehemently opposes the ironic role of media in the disenfranchisement of individuals and feels a strong sense of disappointment in the prevalent ideologies. While media was historically supposed to serve as the "the eyes and ears of the people" with ethical integrity, today it has evolved into something the artist describes as "the ulcer of corruption". Exploring how reality is mediated and distorted by media, the artist wraps his subjects in newsprint entirely, referencing the way media wraps around human life. The viewers are intrigued by these figures and their realities that exist beyond the prints covering them.

Choerudin Roadyn



"Art for me is a need that must be fulfilled"

Choerudin Roadyn is an established artist from Indonesia. His works are marked by the use of circles, which has earned him the nickname Choerudin 'circle'. Largely based on abstract realism, he combines various elements like circles, symbols and other abstract objects to distort the real object, producing unique surrealist, impressionist and expressionist works. He predominantly works on canvas but is highly experimental with his painting techniques creating special accents from brush strokes and paint melting techniques. Choerudin has also worked extensively with other media such as embroidery on canvas, 3D works with fiberglass and many more.

Deddy PAW



"Art is the result of one's thoughts, capacities or skills, and creativity embodied in an action that can be 'enjoyed' by others according to their level of knowledge and perception.

A good artwork is one that can evoke imagination and inspire those who understand the work."

Deddy PAW is an established artist from Indonesia who started his career as an art journalist for Daily Media Indonesia. Since 2003, his artworks have followed the theme of 'the enigmatic apple', based on considerations of its symbolic expressions which provoke concerns, mystery and quandary in the context of human existential dilemmas. The symbolic meaning of apple is associated prominently to love, passion, enjoyment, peace, hope, etc., but diametrically opposite in its interpretations are its aspects of evil, greed and temptation as well. In his works, apple is not a mere model as is often the case with typical still-life paintings. His apples exemplify the concepts of humanity, philosophies, teachings, idealisms, hopes or ideals depending on the context of his work.



Elisa is a young talented artist from Indonesia. She explores the concepts of psychoanalysis and urban spiritualism which bring a surreal nuance to her abstract expressionistic paintings. 




Fery Eka Chandra

Irwanto Lentho




"Art is the process of living life by documenting its beauty. Art creates harmony between reality and imagination."

Irwanto Lentho is an established master artist from Indonesia. Said to have gifted hands, Lentho specializes in wood and hardboard cutting techniques with delicate and intricate designs coloured over by hand. Lentho has a unique style of painting that is influenced by the surrounding marvels and sensations that he experiences in daily life. Nevertheless, with his artistic creativity he transmutes these mundane events into mesmerizing pieces of art. His paintings often feature darker tones to suggest the political struggles within his country. Although the dark colors are dominant, he brings out a buoyant composition without making the whole work melancholic.

Lentho graduated from the Institute of Art in Yogyakarta, Indonesia, and has developed his own style in wood cutting, pointillism and so on. His style of work is time consuming; Some of his works take almost 4 months to develop. However, Lentho feels that time moves slowly and he is able to savour life while he is working. So he dutifully immerses himself in work, cutting and carving the wood little by little, paying great attention to intricate details and then bringing it all together by adding colours.

Januri




"I start with a story and then break it down to brush strokes."

Januri is a fast-rising Indonesian painter with diverse proficiency in styles and media. Januri grew up in a remote farming village which has deeply influenced his themes. Over the years, his work evolved both in terms of the visual language and themes represented. Since the beginning of his career, human figures have been the focal point of his work. In his early practice, he depicted them with transparent color, reflecting on the political condition of his country, while the scenery in the background only had a function of supplementing the figures. Over time, Januri began using darker colors, placing more emphasis on the background. In his recent works, the landscape takes more central role, being rendered with the same strength as his subjects.

Many of his works could be considered as conceptual artworks with a social narrative. Januri feels his work continues the art tradition of artists such as Beckman, Chagall, Francisco de Goya, Gustave Courbet, Diego Rivera, Affandi, Hendra Gunawan, Sudjojoo, Sudjono Kerton and Djoko Pekik, among others.

In his latest works, he has explored Cubism where he has successfully depicted three-dimensional abstract figures on a flat canvas to create intimate narratives.






Joko 'Gundul' Sulistiono

He cleverly uses paper clippings creating unique combinations of cyborg and fossil figures juxtaposing them with sharp lines and textures created with a palette knife. His works centre around socio-political issues, hedonism, consumerism and so on, which he visualizes and narrates with a clever sarcastic style. Jokgun is a very active artist, continuously improvising and experimenting with variousstyles such as realism and surrealism, and media such as 3D installation works with rocks, metals and so on.







Klowor Waldiyono




"Art is a way of life, whether there is an exhibition or not, I keep making artworks.

Mulyo Gunarso

Mulyo weaves a story into each of his artworks. He is a simple person and considers art as his life's mission that he needs to fulfill with responsibility, love and spirit. He derives all his inspiration from home and nature. Home is where he builds a future with his family, while his past memories of living close to nature constantly nourishes his present life. Gunarso enjoys the process of composing tiny details such as letters, lines and objects into a collage that eventually signify something meaningful. 




Burned by Mulyo Gunarso






The Last Dream by Mulyo Gunarso

Nugroho Heri Cahyono






Reza Prastica Hasibuan




Sigit Raharjo

Sri Pramono




"My work is abstract and cryptic up until you focus and ponder."




